

Meditation

The Word of God became flesh and dwelt among us. To those who accepted Him, He gave power to become children of God. Alleluia! John. 1:14a, 12a

In today's readings, Jesus is proclaimed as Lamb of God and Son of God. John the Baptist knew that this was the promised Messiah, who had come to take away the sins of the world. Through Jesus, we are all invited to become children of God in baptism, adopted by a loving Father. This is the baptism with the Holy Spirit of which John speaks.

What a miraculous gift and treasure! Sometimes we may forget just how miraculous it is: that we in our sinful and imperfect state can be made pure and become children of God. By our baptism, we are ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven! This gift can also be given to our families and children because the Lord has made us His own family. God calls us to relationship because of His great love for us.

God is not impersonal, distant and unreachable. He is a loving Father to us, involved in our lives in every way, if we accept *Him.* He will not force us to do so, but He calls us each by name. He invites us to come to know and love and serve Him in this life, so that we may be happy with Him in eternity. So many people reject this amazing gift.
