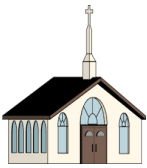

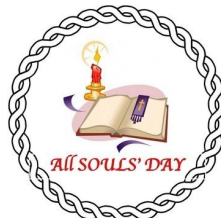


### Volunteers Needed

### Week Behind

As you know, we are allowed to celebrated funeral Masses with 30 or fewer Mass attendees. Thank you, Father Tomas.

**New Mass Schedule beginning October 31-** Last Sunday, October 18, we announced from the pulpit the new Mass schedule for our parish. Starting October 31, Saturday Vigil Massed will be at 5:30 pm in English and 7:00 pm in Spanish. Sunday liturgies will be at 9:00 am, 11:00 am and 5:30 pm in English and 1:00 pm and 7:00 pm in Spanish. We will continue to register in advance for weekend Masses. However, if you do not have access to a computer or you do not know how to register on-line, please come to Mass anyway. You can sign in with a volunteer in the foyer. We are allowed up to 200 people at each Mass. To the best of our abilities, we are following the guidelines of the Centers for Disease Control as well as the protocols stated by our diocese. Thank you so much for your patience as we all continue to deal with COVID-19.

### Week ahead

**Saint Joseph Catholic School-** On Monday, October 26, Saint Joseph School will once again have all elementary students on campus. The school will still be following the PPE and distancing guidelines. I want to thank all the teachers for working so hard during this time of pandemic restrictions and requirements. They have been very diligent in checking the students' temperatures and doing health screenings beginning at 7:50 am. I am grateful to all the parents who pre-screen their children at home before bringing them to school. Currently on-line students will be able to continue attending through Google Meets/ Classroom until they are ready to return in person.
