Week, Nov. 1-7. This annual week-long celebration is dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life through prayer and education. Let us **renew our prayers and support** for those who are considering these vocations.

Meditation

"Teacher, we know that You are a truthful man" - Matthew 22:16

In today's Gospel, the Pharisees use charm in their attempt to trick Jesus with their question about the payment of taxes, but they are unsuccessful. They have unknowingly spoken the truth about Him in saying He is a truthful man, yet they fail to see that He is even more. He is the Truth, and all who follow Him must abide in truth and love. But we all know how difficult that can be. Discerning the truth can be tricky, especially when confronted with complex moral questions.

A good place to begin the search for truth is in the Gospels, guided by Church teachings. This week, on October 22, we celebrate the Feast Day of St. John Paul II. This holy man undertook an examination of moral truth in his encyclical letter *The* Splendor of Truth. In it, John Paul states, "The Church knows that the issue of morality is one which deeply touches every person; it involves all people, even those who do not know Christ and His Gospel or God Himself. She knows that it is precisely on the path of the moral life that the way of salvation is open to all" (VS 3).

John Paul recognizes that "there always remains a yearning for absolute truth and a thirst to attain full knowledge of it. This is eloquently proved by man's tireless search for knowledge... It is proved even more by his search for the meaning of life... it spurs us on to face the most painful and decisive of struggles, those of the heart and of the moral conscience" (VS 1).

Empowered by the great gifts of the Holy Spirit, the guidance of the Church, and "the wisdom and power of Christ Crucified," (VS 117) we can discern "the splendor of truth shining forth in all the works of the Creator and, in a special way, in man, created in the image and likeness of God (cf. Genesis 1:26). Truth enlightens man's intelligence and shapes his freedom, leading him to know and love the Lord."

Religious Education- On Friday, October 2 and Wednesday, October 7, Amalia Del Pozo (Director of Religious Education in Spanish), Susan Marsh (Director of Religious Education in English) and many volunteers of the Religious Education Program helped distribute formation packages to our families. It is the generosity and kindness of these two wonderful women and their RE teams that make possible the different programs of Religious Education in our parish. The Lord has blessed Saint Joseph with the support of Susan, Amalia and the volunteers who teach our children. And, in addition, they help parents fulfill their responsibility to be the first teachers of our Catholic faith to their children.

In-Service Day and Diocesan Mission Congress- On Friday, October 9, the Diocese held its Teacher Excellence Day on-line. I am grateful to the many teachers and SJS principal Perry Kelly who joined the other schools virtually to learn about faith infusion resources and Catholic Charities' mental health resources. In addition, on Saturday October 10, our Religious Education teachers and coordinators attended our Diocesan Mission Congress virtually to learn about technology and how to connect with our youth during the pandemic. Great job to all who participated!

Saint Joseph Catholic School- The annual Fun Run took place on Thursday, October 8, on our school grounds. This year we had an amazing Fun Run event! All our students participated, and we were able to raise over \$32,000.00. This money directly helps teachers in their classrooms with technology and other classroom expenses. It is used to help families who need financial aid, and it helps support PTO activities. Thank you to Perry Kelly, our school principal, and the school staff for helping organize the event. Moreover, thank you for supporting our great school through this yearly event.

Father Riccardo Keolker, Father Larry Reilly, and Father Cesar Izquierdo- I am grateful to Fathers Riccardo and Larry for the many contributions they have made to Saint Joseph Parish, including the daily Gospel reflections, daily Masses, and weekend liturgies. I consider myself very lucky to have them in the parish. We are also fortunate to have Father Cesar Izquierdo who was able to fly to the United States from Rome Thursday afternoon. Thank you for all your prayers during his long journey through the immigration system. His October 14 interview at the U.S. Consulate was canceled but, after the Diocese applied for a "documentation only"

process, he unexpectedly was given an appointment on September 30 and his R-1 religious worker visa was quickly approved.

Update on Covid 19- It is with great happiness that I announce that all five modified phase 1 counties (Benton, Franklin, Chelan, Douglas and Yakima) are now fully in Phase 2 of Safe Start. Among other conditions, Phase 2 permits an increase in attendance for faith-based organizations up to 200 people (or 25% of capacity.) This is great news for us since we have been using Dillon Hall for extra people. Now we will increase the number of people who can register for Mass—that is from 50 to 200 per Mass. Thank you so much for all your prayers and your patience.

Episcopal Council meeting On Tuesday, October 20, Bishop Joseph Tyson and I will be traveling to Mount Angel Seminary to visit our two seminarians, Juan Nieves and William Lane. In addition we will be meeting with the vocations directors of other seminaries to discuss issues related to Mount Angel Seminary as a house of formation. Thank you to Rev. Msgr. Joseph Betschart, President-Rector of Mount Angel Seminary, for his leadership at this institution. Bishop Tyson and other vocations directors from the Pacific Northwest and California will be present at the meeting as well as Archbishop Alexander Sample (Diocese of Portland). I am grateful to be able to attend this meeting in person. Please keep me in your prayers.
