# Week behind

Annual Catholic Appeal-Last weekend we kicked off the ACA. For those of you who have pledged this year, either by filling out the ACA card after Mass or mailing it to the Parish Office, thank you. If you have not participated yet, please prayerfully consider giving this year. You will find ACA envelopes in the foyer of the Big Church or on the back small tables. This year you can also donate on-line by using the Diocese of Yakima website. Remember that you can make a one-time donation or make a pledge with monthly payments. We have a special opportunity each year to answer Christ's call to give to the mission of the Church in Central Washington. This year our parish goal is \$147,114.00—thank you so much for your generosity

**Volunteers**--Because of the COVID-19 realities, we have a much smaller pool of volunteers. They are great—very dependable and helpful—but it's not reasonable to place even more demands on them. Therefore, as we begin to have more people coming to Mass, I asked the Confirmation candidates to help us check people in and clean up after Mass. I am grateful for the many young men and women who are donating their time in assisting us in this task. Please arrive a minimum of ten minutes early for Mass. Before Mass begins our ushers will direct you and those attending with you to pews with spacing that meets social distancing requirements. Your early arrival will help us all, especially those who are checking people in, be attentive to Mass as it begins.

**COVID-19 update -** After Saturday evening Mass, a parishioner approached me with this question: "Is the congregation allowed to sing during Mass?" I did not know the answer, but I told her that I would get back to her. After doing some research, I found this statement in the state's phase 2 religious/ faith-based organizations' COVID-19 requirements: "No choir shall perform during the service. <u>Congregational singing is permitted, but individuals must not re-</u> <u>move their face coverings to sing</u>. Face coverings must stay on for the duration of the service."

**Saint Joseph Catholic School-** on Tuesday, November 10, our St. Joseph School students prayed the rosary for the men and women who are serving and who have served in the U.S. armed forces. The students also made cards to be sent to the local veterans at the Hawthorne Court Retirement Community. I want to thank Felisha Owens and all the teachers who motivated the students to pray and make cards for our veterans. Fabulous job!

**PREPARES-** On Tuesday, November 10, Yolanda Castillo who serves Benton County was here in our parish providing women with clothing, coats, personal items and diapers for their children.
