The Novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe -- The novena in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe began December 3 and continues through December 11 at 6:30pm in Spanish every day in the Big Church. (On Thursday, December 3, because of the First Reconciliation students' confessions in the Big Church, we prayed the novena prayers in the Small Church right after the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.) We will be praying the novena rosary in English after the 8:30 am Mass beginning December 3. If, for any reason you are not able to be with us in person, please pray the rosary with your family at home that day, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, patron saint of the Americas.

Non-perishable Food Items---On Friday, December 4, Arturo Biebrich, our Parish and School maintenance man (and soon to be Deacon) collected non-perishable food items from the parish and school community.
