Pope Francis proclaims "Year of Saint Joseph" — In a new Apostolic Letter entitled <u>Patris</u> <u>corde</u> ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, <u>an obedient father</u>, an accepting father, a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, and a father in the shadows. The Letter marks 150 years since Blessed Pope Pius IX declared Saint Joseph Patron of the Universal Church. To celebrate the anniversary, <u>Pope Francis proclaimed a special "Year of St Joseph," which began on the</u> <u>Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 extending to the same feast in 2021</u>. "My desire to do the year of Saint Joseph increased during the months of the pandemic," Pope Francis writes, noting that many people, like Saint Joseph, have made hidden sacrifices during the crisis in order to protect others. At the conclusion of his Letter, the Pope adds another prayer to Saint Joseph, which he encourages all of us to pray together:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,

Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

To you God entrusted His only Son;

in you Mary placed her trust;

with you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too,

show yourself a father

and guide us in the path of life.

Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage,

and defend us from every evil. Amen.

Starting Monday, December 14, we will be praying this prayer right before the Prayer after Communion.
