COVID 19 Update— During the month of January, the State of Washington posted updated guidance for religious services under the new two-phase reopening plan. The new guidelines permit live music and performances so long as individuals wear face coverings and adhere to physical distancing requirements. Soloist singers are permitted to sing during the service without a mask provided that the individual maintains 15 feet of physical distancing. I want to thank Giovanni and all the cantors who enhance our liturgies with their beautiful voices.

REME HALO Air Purifier— On Monday, January 8, Arturo installed a high-tech device in the air conditioning system of the Big Church. This product, REME HALO, actively purifies the air and kills bacteria and viruses. With this technology, the air circulating in the Big Church is being cleansed of any virus. The device works by producing hydroperoxide plasma and uses ultraviolet light to purify surfaces and the air inside our church building. Thanks to all the volunteers who stay after each Mass to clean the church. Please know that your help is really appreciated.

Pre-marriage Classes— On Friday, February 12, we began our first in-person pre-marriage course in Dillon Hall. Seventeen couples attended the English language session and seventeen more attended the Spanish language session the next day. Assisting couples in the development of sound communication skills is at the heart of this program. Couples share common experiences and issues within their relationships. Areas explored are: Faith, Fair Fighting (communication), Finances, Family, Fertility. The program aims to raise awareness of the couples' relationship strengths and encourages them to discuss some of the critical and practical issues surrounding the marriage commitment. My hope is that the classes will have very positive effects on the couples' relationships now and in their future married lives. Volunteers also act as mentors to mothers and fathers in need. We are most grateful for the services these dedicated parishioners provide to this important ministry. None of this would be possible without the generous donations of parishioners. From those who cannot assist directly, PREPARES always welcomes financial contributions.
