Perpetual Adoration — "What is Eucharistic Adoration?" That is a question we often hear from those new to the faith or searching for ways to deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ. Adoration is a way to be present with the Lord and to focus on actively listening to His word through prayer.

During Perpetual Adoration, <u>as practiced in our parish</u>, the Eucharistic Host, exposed in a monstrance, is in the constant company of the faithful, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Perpetual Adoration started at St. Joseph Parish about 25 years ago. Over the past years, <u>we've heard from many adorers</u> how grateful they are for this intimate time with Jesus. They value the opportunity for reflection in the prayerful atmosphere of our Adoration Chapel. We've also heard how much they missed that time during the pandemic. This time of personal prayer and Adoration has helped community members discern what God wants for them. And it has helped men and women discern their vocations in life. As the fruit of Eucharistic Adoration at Saint Joseph, our diocese has been blessed with three priests and one current seminarian from our community. One person said "Perpetual Adoration is amazing!
