October, the Month of the Rosary — By tradition the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to certain devotions. The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. October 7 is the Feast of our Lady of the Rosary. We will pray the rosary as a community every day before the 8:30 am Mass, Monday through Saturday, in the Small Church. On Sundays we will pray the rosary before the 9:00 am and 1:00 pm Masses. If you are unable to come to church to pray the rosary, please do so at home during the month of October. Let us pray together:

- 1. for the intentions of the Holy Father, Pope Francis, that all baptized people may be engaged in evangelization by being witnesses to the Gospel with their lives
- 2. for an end of the Covid 19 pandemic.
- 3. for the success of the five-year pastoral plan in our parish
- 4. for the protection of human life from the moment of conception to natural death and for respect for the dignity of the human person.

Respect Life Month -- Every October is also Respect Life month in our diocese and throughout the United States. The mission of this special month is to consider more deeply why every human life is valuable and reflect on how to build a culture that protects life from conception to natural death. Respecting life is multi-faceted, including the issues of abortion (beginning of life), assisted suicide (end of life), foster care, homelessness, human trafficking, migration, care for creation, and the death penalty.

Healing Light Retreat – On Saturday, October 2, our parish will host a Healing Light Retreat in the Small Church from 8:30 am to 5:30 pm. The one-day retreat offers a supportive, confidential, and non-judgmental environment where women and men can express, release, and reconcile painful post-abortive emotions to begin the process of restoration, renewal and healing.
