Sign up to take a crucifix (box includes the crucifix, rosary, and prayer cards) home for one week and pray for vocations—all vocations, but especially the Priesthood, Diaconate, and Vowed Religious Life.

The general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the Saturday Vigil Mass) is now reinstated in the

Diocese of Yakima.

As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2181). This exemption applies to those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immuno-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety about contracting the coronavirus in a large group of people.

Here at St. Joseph Parish, we want everyone to experience as safe an environment for worship as possible. Due to the rapidly-spreading Omicron variant of the coronavirus, please continue to observe the following public safety protocols in church:

- Use of masks/facial coverings
- Use of hand sanitizer
