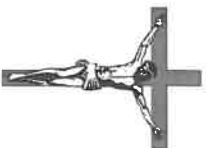
## ANOINTING OF THE SICK

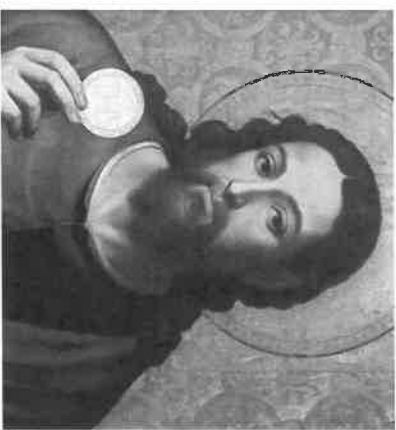

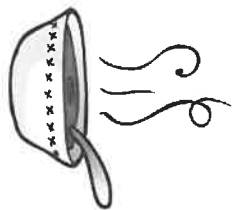
# Lenten Soup Nights

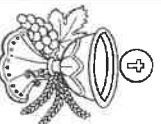

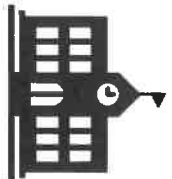

Lent is the 40-day season of penance in preparation for the celebration of the greatest event in human history: the redemption of the human race by Jesus Christ. Lent begins Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022 and ends on Thursday, April 14, followed by the Sacred Triduum, April 14-16, and Easter Sunday, April 17.

### Lenten Disciplines

“All Christians, by the nature of their lives, are obliged to live in a spirit of penance whereby our exterior acts of prayer, self-denial and charity bear witness to the inner values of our Faith.”  
The Church specifies certain practices of penance during the season of Lent.

1. Self-imposed observance of fasting on all weekdays of Lent is strongly recommended.
2. Catholics are obliged to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, March 2 and Good Friday, April 15.
3. The Fridays of Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.
4. Catholics age 14 and older are bound by the law of abstinence.
5. The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat.
6. The law of fasting is obligatory for Catholics from the age of 18 through age 59.
7. The law of fasting prescribes that only one full meal be taken per day; the other meals, if needed, should be significantly smaller, but in accord with one's health needs. Fasting assumes avoidance of food between meals.

The “substantial observance” of these laws is a grave obligation; that is:

1. Anyone who neglects all forms of penance, or deliberately shows contempt for the Church's penitential discipline, may be guilty of serious sin.
2. Occasional failure to observe penitential regulations is not seriously sinful.
3. Proportionately grave circumstances – sickness, dietary needs, social obligation – excuse from the obligation of fast and abstinence, but not from seeking out other forms of penance.

## **Week Behind**

**The Annual Presidents' Day Clergy Gathering with Bishop Joseph Tyson** -- On Monday, February 21, Bishop Tyson had a Zoom meeting with the permanent deacons of our diocese. Their focus was to review a revised version of the ministry agreement for permanent deacons. We are so blessed to have five deacons in our parish who will be working on the ministry agreement for the next three years. I am also happy to announce that Mike Palmieri has completed his deaconate formation, and he will be receiving the ministry of acolyte the third Sunday of Lent, March 20. The bishop will ordain him sometime this coming spring or summer.

**Columbaria at Saint Joseph Parish** —On Wednesday, February 23, I met with the Columbaria Committee. We are looking at short and long term maintenance of the columbaria. We are also considering the possibility of buying a new columbarium with single and double niches since we only have 10 remaining niches in the two existing columbaria. I especially thank Tina Daily for her service and dedication to the columbaria ministry.

**Music Issues and Missals** – On Thursday, February 24, I had a meeting with Giovanni Liguori about music issues and missals in the pews. We do not have the latest music issues and they will take a while to get here. The next missal available is for Holy Week. I will order both and try to get the music issues and missals with Sunday readings by Palm Sunday. I thank Giovanni for his devotion to teaching and leading cantors and choir members and his enthusiasm for the importance of music in our parish.

**Altar Serving Training** – On Friday, February 25, our altar server coordinators trained current and prospective altar servers on what this ministry means and how to serve reverently at Mass. Afterward they played Bingo with the kids and served them pizza. We had a great turn out! I thank Kevin Eldridge, Hugo Cartagena, Lily Villaseñor and Alicia Rodriguez for their dedication to this important ministry.

**Saint Joseph School's Art and Wine On-line Fundraiser** — From Tuesday, February 22, to Saturday, February 26, our school conducted the annual Art and Wine fundraiser event. Even though this year the event and the auction items were only experienced on-line, we had good participation. Your parish priests donated a Mexican dinner for 8 guests. Fathers Cesar, Riccarda, and I will cook, serve, and entertain the guests. The annual Art and Wine event raises funds for important school activities, improvement projects, and scholarships. Many thanks to all the volunteers who helped before, during, and after the event. It was a great success! ## **Week Ahead**

**First Sunday of Lent** -- On Sunday, March 6, we will celebrate the R.C.I.A. Rite of Election at the 9:00 am Mass. The catechumens will be presented to the Catholic community of Saint Joseph. They also will be presented to Bishop Tyson in Yakima at 3:00 pm the same day. Special thanks to the RCIA team members who have worked diligently to prepare the catechumens on their journeys to becoming Catholics and the candidates looking forward to receiving the sacraments of Holy Communion and Confirmation.

Lent is a season rich in symbols and meaning. Here are some suggested ways to help you and your family grow spiritually during Lent.

**Daily Lenten Reflections On-line** – Lent is a season of abundant grace. As we journey into the desert with Christ for 40 days, make His Word your constant companion with free Daily Reflections by Dr. Tim Gray. In three-to-five-minute video reflections, Dr. Gray dives into the Mass readings, opening up the Scriptures and providing you with concrete ideas on how to apply them to your daily lives. You will find the daily reflection on FORMED. If you do not have FORMED on your phone or computer you can download the app and register.

**Word Among Us Booklets** – This Sunday *The Word Among Us* booklets for Lent will be available in the Church foyer placed around the baptismal pool. These contain the daily Scripture readings and meditations for March 2, Ash Wednesday, through April 17, Easter. Please take a copy this weekend.

**Bible Study** – On Wednesday, March 16, we will begin a Bible Study titled *A Biblical Walk through the Mass*. Everything we say and do in the Liturgy is steeped in Biblical language. In this video-based study, Dr. Edward Sri explores the roots of the words and gestures we experience at Mass and explains their profound significance. This fascinating tour of the Mass will renew your faith and deepen your love for and devotion to the Holy Eucharist. Presentations will be on Wednesdays: March 16, March 23, March 30, April 6, and April 13 from 9:15 am to 11:00 am in the meeting room on the second floor of the Parish Office. You can participate in person. The class will be limited to 40 people. Please register at the Parish Office. We hope you can join us.

**Lent and Easter Schedule 202** -- This Sunday please take a bulletin. Inside you will find a purple insert with the schedule of events for Lent, Holy Week and Easter.

**Disciplines of Lent**--Please keep in mind the following:

**Prayer** – Please join us for daily Masses Monday through Friday 6:30 am and 8:30 am and 8:30 am on Saturdays. We also have Reconciliation hours every Saturday from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm. and Thursdays from 5:00 pm to 6:30 pm. On Fridays, Stations of the Cross will be prayed in English at 6:00 pm in the Big Church and in Spanish at 6:00 pm in the Small Church.

**Fasting and Abstinence** are Lenten penitential practices. Fasting is to be observed by Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 on Ash Wednesday (March 2) and Good Friday (4/15). One full meal is allowed. Two smaller meals sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to your needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are permitted.

**Abstinence** – Abstinence is to be observed by Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from eating meat. Those who are unable to observe these penitential practices due to ill health, ability to work, other serious reasons should practice other forms of self-denial suitable to their condition.

**Almsgiving** -- Consider ways you can change your spending habits to include more intentional and prayerful charitable giving.

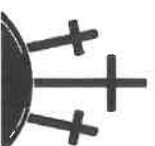

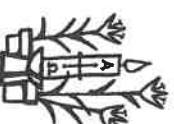
