**Virtus Protecting God's Children Awareness Session --** On Wednesday, May 25, 2022, Saint Joseph Parish will conduct its first Virtus training for volunteers in Dillon Hall at 6:30pm. All people who work or volunteer within the Diocese of Yakima must attend a live VIRTUS session.

Who has to attend a VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children Awareness Session? All priests, deacons, and employees are required to complete the VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children Awareness Session. The training is also required for other ministers and volunteers who may have even occasional unsupervised ministry or contact with children, young people, and vulnerable adults as part of their duties. Where and when are training sessions held?

The training session, called Protecting God's Children for Adults, is going to be held in Dillon Hall in Kennewick at 6:30 pm by VIRTUS® trained facilitators. You <u>must</u> pre-register with VIRTUS® before attending. Walk-ins will, however, be permitted. How do I register for a training session? All priests, deacons, other ministers, employees, and volunteers must pre-register online for Protecting God's Children for Adults by visiting the VIRTUS® website <u>www.virtus.org</u> and selecting Registration. Then select View a List of Sessions, and select Yakima, WA (Diocese). You will then receive the most current schedule of upcoming sessions. To pre-register, click on Start Registration and type in a user id and password. Next, just click on Continue to complete the registration process. How do I register to attend a VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children Awareness Session if I don't have internet access? All members of the clergy, employees and adult volunteers must pre-register online. If you don't have access to the internet, please call the parish or school where you work or volunteer.
