Women of Saint Joseph -- The Women of Saint Joseph graciously offered \$5,000 toward pavement of Church parking lot which includes the lines exiting by the Annex. They also offered to pay for the cost of the asbestos removal from the basement in the Small Church and for a new shed from Home Depot to store sports equipment that is now in the PAC's shower room. We are very grateful to the Women of Saint Joseph for all their hard work in raising the funds for these needs of our parish and school as well as their prayers and support for our parish pastoral plan. Their interest means a great deal to the Saint Joseph community. We are so appreciative of all their assistance.

End of the School Year Activities -- This past Friday our school students gathered after the 10:30 am Mass to install the new student council members. There are many reasons to be grateful for the graces of this year. In a special way, we thank the students who dedicated their time and talent to continue with the mission of the school. We also thank their teachers who have guided them to a deeper understanding of our Catholic faith. We continue to pray for all the new council members, and we assure them of our prayers and best wishes as they undertake their important tasks next school year.

Ordination to the Priesthood – Congratulations to Deacon Christian Melendez who was ordained to the priesthood Friday, May 27, 2022. We ask the Lord to bless him in his future priestly ministry in the Diocese of Yakima. We know that this is a great joy for him and for his family who came from Puerto Rico, as well as for the Church. We assure him of our continued prayers and best wishes.

Annual Catholic Appeal – Our parish goal for the 2022 Annual Catholic Appeal is \$136,575.00. Thank you, all parishioners who donated or are donating to the ACA this year. The amount pledged this year is \$171,757.00 and the amount collected, as of April 30, is \$121,879.00. The number of parish households that have participated in the ACA this year is 412. We are 89% of the way to achieving our goal. Almost there! Thank you for your generosity. Your giving makes a difference in our diocese and parish.

May Crowning- On Sunday, May 1, our parish community gathered for a May Crowning ceremony which began at the 9:00 am Sunday Mass. Thank you to Lily Rangel and the ladies who brought flowers for the statue of Our Lady during the month of May. The traditional May Crowning was one way we honored Mary this month; another was the multilingual rosary.

Multilingual Rosary – On Saturday, May 28, we gathered for the last time this year to pray the rosary for the intentions of the Holy Father for peace and youth and for our parish pastoral plan

and the success of the synod process. I want to thank the faithful who have been praying the rosary **every Saturday** during May after the 8:30 am Mass outside the Small Church.

Saint Joseph Children's Center – I thank Trisha Osborne, our Child Center Director, whose last full-time day working for us was on Thursday, May 26, 2022. She will be working part-time during the month of June or until we find a new director.
