#### Week Behind

Concert Tuesday—On Tuesday, June 7, at 7:00 PM our school held a magnificent music concert for school parents and family members outside the Children's Center. The concert included singing by all students in grades K-8 and some students playing marimbas or string instruments. The kids had a great time sharing their talents with their relatives. I thank Giovanni Liguori, our parish music director, and Perry Kelly, SJS principal, who organized the event and led the students' performances. It was a fun evening.

Restoring Distribution of Precious Blood Delayed—After consulting on June 1 with the Executive Committee of the Council of Priests, Bishop Joseph Tyson has extended to September 14 the tentative date to restore the distribution of the Precious Blood at Mass to the lay faithful. We hope that the celebration of the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on that date will be enhanced by a return to our pre-pandemic practice.

Weekend Mass Count—We will be conducting Mass counts this weekend (all Saturday Vigil and Sunday Masses), which should give us a good "snapshot in time" of attendance as we finish up our parish pastoral plan and our parish Synodal process. That information will assist us in planning for the future. Special thanks to the Parish Council and parish staff who helped me in the process.

Religious Education Coordinator—Our parish is in the process of hiring a Religious Education Coordinator. The Religious Education Coordinator's responsibility is to oversee the parish Religious Education program for children and youth in preparation for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation, utilizing in-depth knowledge of faith formation and following the operations and procedures of Saint Joseph Parish. Membership and active participation in the Catholic Church are required to fulfill the responsibilities of the Religious Education Coordinator position. #### Week Ahead
