A New Academic Year – On Monday, August 29, our school began the new academic year with a prayer and blessing. The school year begins with a total enrollment of 302 students in preschool and grades K through 8, as well as numerous students for the Montessori program. I am grateful to Perry Kelly, principal; Rachel Cobb, Children's Center coordinator, Deacon Bill and all our teachers and school volunteers who worked hard to welcome all students and ease the transition for the new children.

Father Riccardo Keolker, Father Larry Reilly, Father John Vogl and Father Cesar Izquierdo- I am grateful to Fathers Riccardo and Larry for the many contributions they made to Saint Joseph Parish, including the Sunday readings reflections by Father Riccardo, Saturday morning mass by Father Reilly, Tuesday daily Masses and Confession on Saturdays by Father Vogl and preparation for marriage, daily Masses, and many other pastoral assistances by Father Cesar. I consider myself very lucky to have them as coworkers in the parish.

Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) 2022- last month I received good news regarding our Annual Catholic Appeal. The good news is that **we** have achieved our goal for the 2022 ACA! We should be proud of our efforts! we are now in "rebate status." Let me show you some numbers:

Our ACA goal for 2022 \$ 136,575----Total ACA pledges made \$ 180,248---Potential rebate to Saint Joseph Parish \$ 43,667. As always, I thank you for your stewardship of treasure, which keeps our parish and our diocese in sound financial condition, especially in these times of inflation. You are aware, I am sure, that any costs that are increasing in your own household are also increasing at the parish level—at the "household of God." May God bless you for your continued generosity.

Religious Education/Parish and School--After consultation with the Executive Committee of the Council of Priests, Bishop Tyson has approved changing the age for Confirmation in the Diocese of Yakima from 11the grade (or about 16 years of age) to 8th grade (or about 13 years of age). This is good news for our school and parish since remote preparation for the sacrament will now begin in sixth grade and immediate preparation in seventh and eighth grade. **Our older students already in formation programs will finish their preparation and our parish will implement new formation programs for younger students**.

Please note that preparation for the sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation requires attendance at religious education classes on Saturday or Wednesday and or Catholic School prior to receiving the sacraments.

Doris Rosenow and Maria Rodrigues at the parish and Kimberly and Megan at the school head up our First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation preparation programs. Priest Retirement & Seminarian Education Collection- I want to thank for donating to the priest retirement and seminarian education. Currently projected financial funding for our retired priests (*and for the remainder of those who will retire*) is **underfunded** by **16%**. For our seminarians, "the financial picture" is even more challenging, as this endowment is **underfunded** by **49%**, leaving the future funding for formation of men for priesthood a grave concern here in the Diocese of Yakima.
