Parish Office—The Parish Office will be closed on Monday, February 20, in observance of Presidents' Day. The office will re-open with regular hours on Tuesday, February 21.

Bishop Joseph Tyson—On Tuesday, February 21, Bishop Tyson will celebrate a funeral Mass for the repose of the soul of Camerina Mariscal. Mrs. Mariscal was a long-time parishioner and the mother of Father Jesus Mariscal, parochial vicar at St. Paul Cathedral and son of St. Joseph Parish. I thank the parish staff and the Guadalupanas who are organizing the reception for the family and guests.

We will have two sessions: one in the morning in the Parish Office second floor rooms from 9:30 am to 11:00 am and one in the evening from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm in the Parish Office Conference Room. Art and Wine School Fundraiser —The Art & Wine fundraiser for Saint Joseph School will be <u>in person</u> this year! There will also be an on-line silent auction. First Sunday of Lent—On Sunday, February 26, we will celebrate the O.C.I.A. Rite of Sending Catechumens for Election. The catechumens will be presented to the Catholic community of our parish at the 9 am. Mass. In the afternoon, they will be presented to Bishop Tyson for the Rite of Election at Holy Family Parish in Yakima. Special thanks to Danette Hester, Deacon Herman Farias, Maria Rodriguez, Doris Rosenow, and the OCIA team who have worked diligently to prepare the catechumens on their journeys to becoming Catholics and the candidates looking forward to receiving the sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Communion this Easter.

Disciplines of Lent--Please keep in mind the following:

Prayer--Please join us for daily Masses Monday through Friday 6:30 am and 8:30 am and 8:30 am on Saturdays. We are also holding Reconciliation hours every Saturday from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm. There will be a parish penance service on Thursday, March 9 at 6:00 pm in the Big Church. On Fridays, Stations of the Cross will be prayed in English at 6:00 pm in the Big Church and in Spanish at 6:00 pm in the Small Church. Moreover, on Thursdays during Lent we will have 5:15 pm Bilingual Masses in the Small Church followed by Soup Nights at 6:00 pm in Dillon Hall.

Fasting—One full meal is allowed. Two other meals to maintain strength may be taken according to your needs; however, those meals should be smaller than usual. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are permitted.

Abstinence—Eating meat is not allowed.

We are asked to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday (February 22) and Good Friday (April 7). In addition we abstain from meat on all Fridays during Lent. Note: the obligation of fasting binds Catholics who are 18-59 years old. The obligation of abstinence applies to those 14 years and older. These requirements do not apply when health or ability to work would be seriously affected.

Almsgiving—During the Lenten season, consider ways you can change your spending habits and be more intentional and prayerful in your giving. Here are a few ideas: Fill up your CRS Rice Bowl, increase your weekly donation to St Joseph Parish, contribute to the ACA, and do acts of charity for other people.
