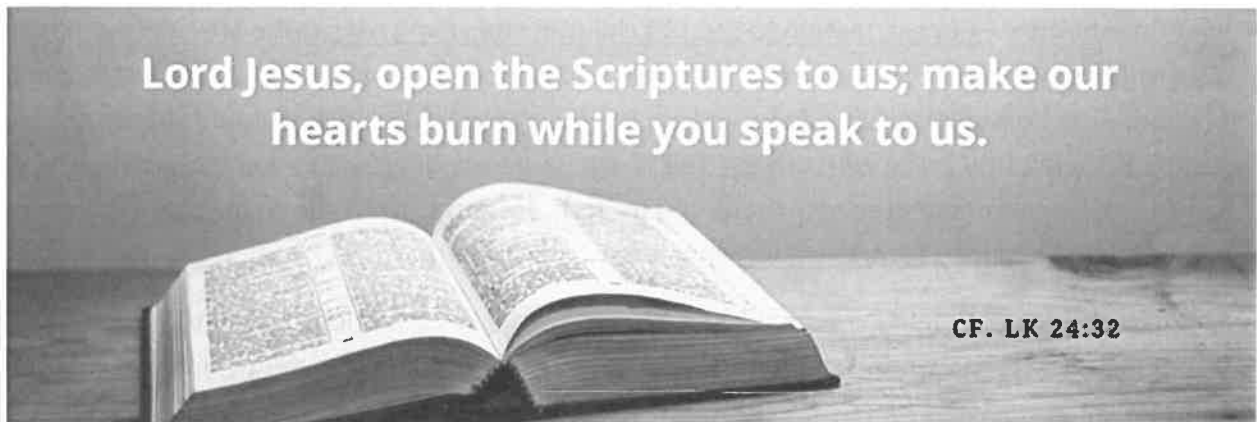

First Reconciliation & First Communion

- Preparation begins in first grade
- 2-year program (must attend consecutively)
Regular attendance for Mass and classes, as well as active participation in class is necessary.
- Must provide baptism-certificate at time of registration even if baptized at St. Joseph.
- Must register their child each year.
- \$50 per student to cover book and materials



Ongoing Faith Formation (Post Communion)

- For children and youth who have already received their first communion.

RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children/teens)

- Unbaptized children ages 7 and up.
- 2 year program
- This program has supplementary classes for the students, Parents, and Godparents.
- Regular attendance for Mass and classes, as well as active participation in class is necessary.
All students who are ready and prepared will receive the sacraments at the Easter Vigil in their second academic year of classes.
- Must provide state issued birth certificate at time of registration.
- \$50 per student to cover book and materials.

Confirmation Program

- Students must be in grades 7-10 grade and have previously received the First Communion (Eucharist).
- Please provide copy of the baptism and first communion certificate at time of registration.
- 2-year program – weekly classes (must attend consecutively).
- Regular attendance for Mass and classes, as well as active participation in class is necessary.
- Must attend a retreat in the second year of preparation.
- 15 hours of Christian service must be competed each year.
- Registration is required each year.
- \$50 per student to cover book and materials.
Note: A confirmation Sponsor is required.

- The Quinceañera must have previously received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist). Please present a copy of the Quinceañeras First Communion certificate when making the registration.
- **If she has not received the Sacrament of Confirmation, she must register for the classes at the Parish Office during the month of May 2023.**
- Reservation will be on a first-come, first-served basis.
- All Masses are individual and take place in the small church on the fourth Saturday of the month at 11:00 am and 2:00 pm.

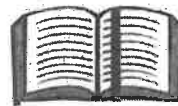
