Week Behind

The lectors really appreciated the presentation and I thank Danny for communicating the beauty of being lectors for our parish.

Synthesis Day—Synod Update: Youth— On Saturday, May 20, some catechists, youth ministers and leaders of our parish attended Bishop Joseph Tyson's presentation on youth and the synod process at the St. Paul Cathedral in Yakima. I am very grateful for the dedication and service of our catechists and for their sharing the faith and mission with children, youth, and adults of our parish.

2024 Quinceañera Program

A Quinceañera is a joyous celebration of a young woman — a Quinceañera— reaching the age of 15. The celebration is a way of acknowledging that the young woman has reached maturity and is ready to take on additional responsibilities. Most importantly, the celebration reaffirms her religious faith and the traditional virtues of the Catholic family.

In order to celebrate a Quinceañera at St. Joseph Church, the following requirements must be met:

- The Quinceañeras parents must be registered (provide your envelope # at moment of making registration) in the parish and be actively attending Sunday Mass.
- The Quinceañera must have previously received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist). Please present a copy of the Quinceañeras First Communion certificate at the moment of registration.
- Beginning May 1, 2023, please register her for the Confirmation program at the Parish Office if she has not received Confirmation.
- As part of the formation process, the Quinceañera will need to attend youth group on a weekly basis and six supplementary classes.
- The Quinceañera is required to attend a weekend youth retreat.
- Parent and Quinceañera service hours: The Quinceañera must complete 20 service hours and the parents must complete 10.

Registration & Reservations will only take place on August 1 2023 thru December of 2023 at the parish office. Reservations for 2024 will not be accepted after this date. Reservations will be on a first-come, first-served basis.

All Masses for Quinceañeras are all held in the small church on the fourth Saturday of the month at 11:00 am and 2:00 pm. For more information, contact the parish office at 509-586-3820 Ext. 101.

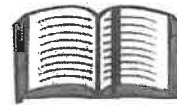

For Catholics, the Sacrament of Marriage or Holy Matrimony is a public sign that one gives oneself totally to this other person. It is also a public statement about God: the loving union of husband and wife speaks of family values and also God's values.

Marriage Preparation

After you initially contact the Parish Office expressing interest in celebrating your wedding at St. Joseph, you will be contacted by the priest to arrange to meet at the Parish Office at a mutually convenient time. Only after having this first meeting will you be able to reserve a date for 2024. Keep in mind that the length of preparation for marriage is approximately six months. No weddings are scheduled during Lent or Advent. The times available on Saturday are 11:00 am and 2:00 pm. We will begin adding couples to the appointment list beginning in June. The calendar for 2024 will open July 1.

Sacrament of Baptism for Infants

Deadline: All baptismal registrations MUST be completed one month prior to Baptism. To reserve dates, parents must register at the Parish Office in person.

September 16

Baptism Class:

All parents and Godparents are required to participate in pre-Baptism classes. Once parents register, we will give them the information for the classes.

Godparents: If there are two, one must be male and the other female. They must be practicing Catholics, at least 16 years of age, and must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, Reconciliation, and Confirmation.
