BAPTISMS

"As a rule an adult is to be baptized in his or her parish and an infant in the parish of the parents unless a just cause suggests otherwise." (Canon Law 587 and 2) If you are a parishioner who attends St. Joseph and would like to baptize your child in another parish, you will need a letter from the pastor of St. Joseph giving you permission to do so. If you are not a St. Joseph parishioner and want to baptize your child in this parish, you need to get permission from your pastor to baptize your child here. The parents and sponsors must attend a class before the Baptism of the child.

First step for Marriage Preparation:

Initial interviews in English for couples desiring to prepare for a wedding in 2024.

Only after having this first meeting will you be able to reserve a date for 2024. Keep in mind that the length of preparation is approximately six months.

All parents and Godparents are required to participate in pre-Baptism classes. Once parents register, we will reserve the date for the in-person classes.

Godparents: If there are two, one must be male and the other female. They must be practicing Catholics, at least 16 years of age, and must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, Reconciliation, and Confirmation.
