BAPTISMS

“As a rule an adult is to be baptized in his or her parish and an infant in the parish of the parents unless a just cause suggests otherwise.” (Canon Law 587 and 2) If you are a parishioner who attends St. Joseph and would like to baptize your child in another parish, you will need a letter from the pastor of St. Joseph giving you permission to do so. If you are not a St. Joseph parishioner and want to baptize your child in this parish, you need to get permission from your pastor to baptize your child here. The parents and sponsors must attend a class before the Baptism of the child.

First Reconciliation & First Communion

- Preparation begins in first grade.
- 2-year program – weekly classes (must attend consecutive years). Regular attendance for Mass and classes, as well as active participation in class is necessary.
- Must provide Baptism certificate at time of registration even if baptized at St. Joseph.
- Registration is required each year.
- \$50 per student to cover text book and materials.

Ongoing Faith Formation (Post Communion)

- For children and youth who have already received their First Communion.

OCIC (Order of Christian Initiation for Children)

- Unbaptized children ages 7 and up.
- 2-year program – weekly classes (must attend consecutive years).
- Regular attendance for Mass and classes, as well as active participation in class is necessary. All students who are ready and prepared will receive the sacraments at the Easter Vigil in their second academic year of classes.
- Must provide state issued birth certificate at time of registration.
- Registration is required each year
- \$50 per student to cover book and materials.
Note: A Godparent/Sponsor is required.

Confirmation Program

- Students must be in grades 7-10 grade and have previously received the First Communion (Eucharist).
- Please provide a copy of the baptism and first communion certificate.
- 2-year program – weekly classes (must attend consecutive years).
- Regular attendance for Mass and classes, as well as active participation in class is necessary.
- Must attend the second year Confirmation retreat.
- 15 hours of Christian service must be completed each year.
- Must provide Baptism & First Communion certificates at time of registration even if sacraments were received at St. Joseph.
- Registration is required each year.
- \$50 per student to cover text book and materials.
Note: A confirmation Sponsor is required.

OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults)

- The OCIA is the process by which people enter into to Church or complete their Sacraments of initiation. The process is concerned with the total formation of the person including believing, living, praying, and serving with our Parish community. This process runs from September through Easter Vigil, where all those that have successfully gone through the process will celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation which include Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. Note: A godparent/ Sponsor is required.
- Birth Certificate is required if all sacraments of initiation are needed.
- Baptism Certificate is required if First Communion & Confirmation are needed.
- No registration fee required.

Catholic Home Missions Appeal 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Soon, our diocese will take up a collection for the **Catholic Home Missions Appeal on April 27-28**. Home mission dioceses have small or widely dispersed Catholic populations, large or rugged areas of land that make it difficult to minister to the needs of the people, or economic challenges caused by poverty, unemployment, or natural disasters.

In the Diocese of Amarillo, the diocesan criminal justice ministry answers Christ's call to visit and serve prisoners and patients confined to hospitals. Since 2004, this ministry has expanded to bring the Eucharist, Sacred Scripture, and prayer to inmates of the seven prisons and two large hospitals in the diocese. This ministry of mercy includes retreats during which inmates can encounter the love of Jesus, heal from past failures and wounds, and develop new hope for the future. Many inmates have experienced spiritual conversions that have inspired them to join formation programs and enter the Catholic Church.

The criminal justice ministry is one of many innovative outreach efforts made by dioceses supported by Catholic Home Missions. Your participation in the annual Catholic Home Missions Appeal supports dioceses throughout the United States and its territories that need financial help to sustain core pastoral services and missions of mercy to those they serve.

For 2024, Catholic Home Missions is providing \$140,000 to the Diocese of Yakima, for seminarian education and adult religious formation.

Llamado para las Misiones Católicas 2024

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo,

Muy pronto, nuestra diócesis hará una colecta para el Llamado a las Misiones Católicas del 27 al 28 de abril. Las diócesis misioneras tienen unas poblaciones católicas que están esparcidas en grandes áreas de terracería escabrosa que dificulta responder a las necesidades de las personas que también enfrentan desafíos económicos causados por la pobreza, el desempleo, o por desastres naturales.

En la Diócesis de Amarillo, el ministerio diocesano de juicio penal responde al llamado de Cristo para visitar y servir a los presos y a las personas confinadas en hospitales. Desde el 2004, este ministerio se ha expandido y lleva la Eucaristía, las Sagradas Escrituras y la oración a los presos de las siete prisiones y los dos hospitales grandes en la diócesis. Este ministerio de misericordia incluye retiros en los cuales los presos pueden encontrar el amor de Jesús, sanar de las heridas y fracasos de su pasado y crear una nueva esperanza para el futuro. Muchos de los presos han experimentado conversiones espirituales que los han inspirado a ingresar a programas de formación y unirse a la Iglesia Católica.

El ministerio de juicio penal es una de muchas e innovadoras labores de extensión que realizan las diócesis financiadas por las Misiones Católicas. Su participación en el Llamado anual para las Misiones Católicas apoya a las diócesis en Estados Unidos y sus territorios que necesitan ayuda financiera para mantener los servicios pastorales básicos y las misiones de misericordia para aquellos a quienes sirven.

La Diócesis de Yakima ha recibido \$140,000 de las Misiones Católicas para la educación de los seminaristas y la formación religiosa para los adultos para el año 2024.

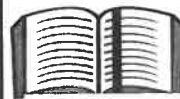

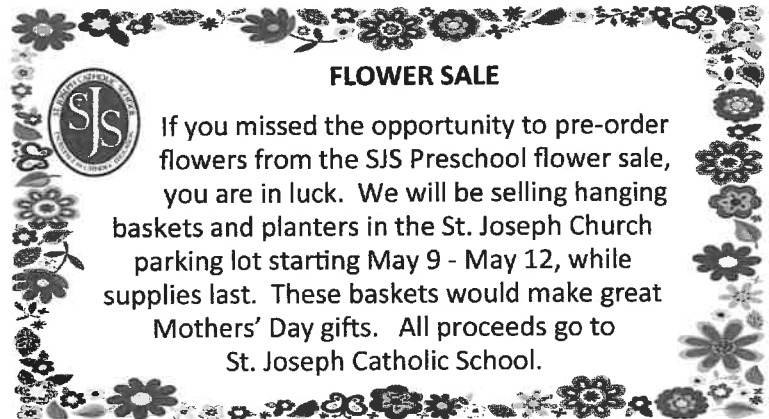
