

2025 Quinceañera Program

A Quinceañera is a joyous celebration of a young woman — a Quinceañera— reaching the age of 15.

The celebration is a way of acknowledging that the young woman has reached maturity and is ready to take on additional responsibilities. Most importantly, the celebration reaffirms her religious faith and the traditional virtues of the Catholic family.



In order to celebrate a Quinceañera at St. Joseph Church, the following requirements must be met:

- The Quinceañera's parents must be <u>previously registered</u> (provide your envelope # at moment of making registration) in the parish and be actively attending Sunday Mass.
- The Quinceañera must have <u>previously received</u> the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist). Please present a copy of the Quinceañera's First Communion certificate at the moment of registration.
- Please register her for the Confirmation program at the Parish Office with Doris or Maria if she has not received Confirmation.
- As part of the formation process, the Quinceañera will need to attend <u>youth group</u> on a weekly basis (Aug. 2024– June 2025) and six supplementary classes.
- The Quinceañera is required to attend a weekend youth retreat (Pre Easter Youth Retreat).
- Parent and Quinceañera service hours: The Quinceañera must complete 20 service hours and the parents must complete 10.

Registration and reservations will only take place on August 1-30, 2024 at the Parish Office. Reservations for 2025 will not be accepted after this date. Reservations will be on a first-come, first-served basis. All Masses for Quinceañeras are all held on the fourth Saturday.

INFANT BAPTISMS

Thank you for choosing life! The Lord has blessed you with the gift of a child and now you have made the important decision to have your child baptized in the Catholic Church.

Baptisms at our parish are celebrated in groups on the third Saturday of the month (except for Lent and Advent).

Before a date is set all paperwork must be completed and turned in with required documents (at the same time) one month prior.

TO REGISTER FOR A BAPTISM

- Pick up a registration packet at the Parish Office during office hours or download a packet off our website. https://stjoseph-kennewick.org/baptism
- Provide a copy of infant's birth certificate (must be a legal copy from the state, not a certificate from the hospital.)
- There is to be only one male godparent or one female
- godparent or one of each. Complete guidelines included in the registration packet.
- Godparents must submit copies of their confirmation
- · certificates.
- Parents and Godparents must attend the Baptism class in person.
- Suggested donation of \$50.00 per child (non refundable.)

If you are not a parishioner and want to baptize your child in this parish, you will need a letter from your parish pastor granting you permission to have your child baptized at St. Joseph Parish.

If the child is older than 7 years, they will need to register them for the Religious Education program (2-year program). Registrations will begin May 1st.)



The Diocese of Yakima Prepares To Welcome Two New Priests

Two transitional deacons of the Diocese of Yakima are eagerly awaiting their May 24 ordination to the priesthood. Deacons John Washington and Antonio Garcia will be ordained in a 6 p.m. rite at St. Joseph Church in Wenatchee.

"I'm excited, but at the same time, I'm kind of nervous," observed Garcia, who grew up in Queseria, Colima, Mexico. "There will be more responsibilities," he noted, "but I'm so happy to be ordained."

"I can't believe it," added Washington, a native of the state of Georgia, in discussing how soon ordination day was coming. "I'm grateful. I'm excited. I'm a little anxious to get out there and get started – and not mess anything up!"

Deacon Washington, who has been studying at Mundelein Seminary in Illinois for the past seven years, is a convert from the Baptist faith.

"What I'm really excited about is my parents and my siblings are going to be at the ordination," he noted. "They'll be able to see what I've been doing for the past seven years." He then will say his first Mass on May 26 in Wenatchee, followed by a June 2 Mass at St. Luke the Evangelist Church in Dahlonega, Georgia, where he became a Catholic.

After finishing his theology studies at the Seminario Hispano in Mexico City, Deacon

Garcia has been assisting at St. Andrew's Church in Ellensburg and attending English-language classes at Central Washington University.

Deacon Garcia's family will not be able to attend the ordination, but he will return to his hometown in Colima, Mexico, to say his first Mass on May 29, so that they can be with him then.

Each deacon will bring some special items to the May 24 ordination. Deacon Garcia will have a chalice given to him by Father Jesus Alatorre, who, along with Father Cesar Vega, will serve as "godfather" for him that day. Father Edgar Quiroga will provide a chasuble (the outer vestment worn by a priest at Mass). Deacon Washington will have a special chalice made in Colombia and given to him by friends, which will feature images of the four Evangelists -- with Saint Luke

Blessed Mother Endured Much, Is There for Us Through Prayer-

When we think of Blessed Mother, it's easy to picture someone with unattainable perfection and a serene smile, floating on a billowing white cloud. However, just like us, Mary was a human being who faced incredible trials in her life and experienced sadness, worry and the responsibilities of day-to-day life.

"Mary didn't live in a bubble," observed Very Rev. Michael Ibach, judicial vicar of the Diocese of Yakima and parochial vicar of Holy Family Parish. "She would have had all of the anxieties, the fears, the apprehensions that all of us have."

Yet, in this month of May, as we specially honor Blessed Mother, we can be inspired by her beautiful spirit of acceptance and trust in God, Father said.

Beginning with the Annunciation, when the Angel Gabriel appeared to tell Mary she was to become the Mother of God, the Bible takes us through some of her extraordinary life experiences.

"After the Annunciation, I'm sure she had a real fear of how the community was going to react, how Joseph (would) react," Father explained. "She must have wondered, 'Will I be ostracized from the community?" She so willingly said

"yes" to the angel's message, and then, "after thinking about it, the reality of life came to be."

Today, we also have worries about how our positive decisions will be received by those around us, he said. If I am



Pope Francis may be inviting us to now meditate on the third image of the Church: The Temple of the Holy Spirit. Who most personifies this temple? The Blessed Virgin Mary! She is the "temple" that bears Jesus. She ponders the mystery of God-in-the-flesh and invites us to do the same. The very mysteries of the Rosary invite us to meditate on the life of Jesus through the eyes of his mother, Mary.

While still Cardinal Archbishop of Buenos Aires, the future Pope Francis played a key role in writing the "Aparecida" document with its rich references to the Blessed Virgin Mary. The most visited religious pilgrimage site in the world is the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico. It is even more visited than Saint Peter's in Rome! This Marian spirituality might be the interpretive key for understanding the current synod process. "Ven con nosotros a caminar, Santa Maria ven." "Come walk with us. Holy Mary, come."

This famous Marian hymn refrain suggests that even as we note the Blessed Virgin Mary as she accompanies us, so too, do we accompany each other. Pope Francis' synod process is one of accompaniment. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, alongside the "temple" that bears Jesus, we, like Mary, ponder the Word of God made flesh. If we are to become a people that accompanies and listens, it is because we first have conversed with the Word of God and we have listened to how God's Word

resonates with our journey of faith.

Here across the Diocese of Yakima, visitation teams came to nearly half the parishes in my first years as bishop. With the advent of the synod process of Pope Francis, many parishes conducted listening sessions both in English and Spanish. People also responded via surveys. The diocesan pastoral council headed by Deacon Michael Gaulke sifted through some 1,600 data points. Listening and discerning, they suggested six priority areas that emerged from the parish conversations, listening sessions and surveys: (1) Engaging our Youth (2) Speaking out and Being Heard (3) Creating Community (4) Decision Making and Governance (5) Priests are Unified but Tired (6) Mission and Community Outreach.

Deacon Gaulke led the Yakima priests in a process of weighing out the six areas so we could develop strategic goals. He and Gabi Hernandez, also from our pastoral council, did the same with around 350 Spanish-language catechists and around 100 English language catechists from across the Diocese of Yakima during the Church Mission Congress.

A mixed group from the diocesan pastoral council and the diocesan finance council helped me formulate strategic goals that could be shared across the parishes and schools and among the major language and cultural groups:

In addition, Mary lived in poverty, Father pointed out. "She had to clean the floor, do dishes, do the laundry, change diapers - all the daily tasks." Joseph's work as a carpenter would not have made him wealthy, perhaps having to wait sometimes between jobs, and facing uncertainty as to when money would be coming in.

When Mary and Joseph took the Baby Jesus to the Temple, to present Him in accordance with the regulations of the Torah, Mary was told that "a

sword will pierce your heart." Then, they had to flee into Egypt, no doubt a long and difficult journey. With our TREASURE, we can be generous with our financial gifts. This could mean returning a portion of the money we have been given by God and giving cheerfully without expecting anything in return. No gift is too small or insignificant.

Remember, Stewardship isn't some exclusive club. We all are stewards! Living a stewardship lifestyle is a series of conversions: changes that soften our hearts and make room for the Holy Spirit to enter and work through us. As the Body of Christ, we are called to help each other strengthen our relationship with the Holy Trinity and with each other.

The whole point of Stewardship is to help each other get to Heaven! Living a

stewardship lifestyle:

- Takes time time to pray.
- Is difficult demands placing
 God first and not putting other "gods"
 before Him.
- Means taking risks detaching ourselves from our time, comfort, possessions, and money.
- Involves placing our complete trust in God and being generous with all of our gifts, especially the one that means the most to us.

Stewardship requires action. The actions of past generations built the Church. It is our responsibility to develop and nurture our gifts for future generations. Stewardship isn't easy, but it has tremendous rewards. Stop and think: when you stand before God and He asks what you have done with the gifts He has given you, how will you respond?

In addition to four national pilgrimage routes, many dioceses, including Yakima, are preparing for the national congress with local processions and special Masses, particularly around the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) on Sunday, June 2. Clergy of the Diocese also will be studying the "Bread of Life" Sunday gospel readings, primarily

from Saint John, to preach about the Eucharist through late July and August.

It is the culmination both of God's action sanctifying the world in Christ and of the worship (we) offer to Christ and through Him to the Father in the Holy Spirit" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1325).
