As Christians, we celebrate a funeral in order to offer worship, praise, and thanksgiving to God for the gift of life, which has now returned to Him. The celebration of the Catholic Funeral Rites is a way to remind us of God's mercy, and to bring hope and consolation, in a difficult time of grief and sorrow. You and your deceased loved one will be remembered in our prayers in the coming days, and at all of our weekend Masses.

The first step in the funeral planning process is to contact the funeral home of your choice to handle the necessary arrangements.

As part of this process, the funeral home will contact our parish office, on your behalf, to schedule a time for the funeral and the rosary. Please know that we try our best to accommodate a family's desired date and time (depend on availability of the Church & Priest) for a loved one's funeral. The second step: Once the date and time have been determined, a member of our parish staff will contact you to schedule an appointment to assist you in details like music, readings, rosary, and a reception if it is requested.

EMERGENCY

If there is an emergency and need immediate assistance for the Sacrament of the Sick, call the parish number (509-586-3820) and PRESS #5 to contact a Priest.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK FOR THEY DYING



While a priest will always do everything in his power to come, if you have a loved one who is actively dying, please do not wait until the last moment to call for Anointing.

We want to ensure that there is adequate time for your loved one to receive the sacrament. Call the parish office at 509-586-3820 to request an anointing (there is a prompt for after hours emergencies).




