He was noted for his cheerfulness, computer skills, and deep devotion to the Eucharist, which became a core theme of his life. Acutis was beatified by Pope Francis on 10 October 2020, two days before the 14th anniversary of his death. Currently, he is on track to become the first canonized millennial in the Catholic church.


