



ope is alive and growing in Lucius Moran's family. His twin boys, Timothy and Theodore, caught the community's attention a little over a year ago when they were delivered by Father Jesús Mariscal in the Shrine to Our Lady at St. Paul Cathedral. Their mother was unable to care for the newborns and Lucius learned of their birth while completing an in-patient alcohol treatment program.

Lucius stepped up to the challenge and with the support of a caring community is raising the twins, along with his 3-year-old daughter and 8-year-old stepson.

Catholic Charities began walking alongside this extraordinary father shortly after the twins' birth, supporting him in the role of full-time single father by mentoring him, by providing parenting information and expertise, and by connecting him with essential needs such as furniture, household supplies, diapers and clothing.

The story of these boys, whose lives began so precariously, has blossomed into an inspiring story of hope. The community has responded to the miracle of their birth with the kindness and support Lucius needs in his new role. "This experience affirmed what the church teaches us in that all human life is valued regardless of the way in which a child enters the world," reflects Father Mariscal.



Lucius expresses gratitude to those who have supported him and helped him step up to challenges of parenthood. "I am so grateful for the many ways Catholic Charities, the church, and the community have rallied around us, helping me to do what I am called to do as a father."

The love and support Lucius continues to receive fills him with hope for the future. "I have so many hopes and dreams. My children are miracles and they are the incentive I need to work hard, to be the best person I can be, and to give them all the love they deserve."

A NOTE FROM SERRA CLUB OF THE TRI CITIES

"Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me Your paths, guide me in Your truth, and teach me, for You are God my savior, and for You I wait all the day." (Psalm 25) The psalmist asks God to show him what the Lord wants him to do. Have you done that lately? Perhaps He will ask you to serve Him as a priest, permanent deacon, brother, or sister.

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which is the patronal feast of the United States and a holy day of obligation, will be celebrated on Monday, December 9. In keeping with past practice, Bishop Joseph Tyson is dispensing the Faithful from the obligation to attend Mass this day. He encourages us nonetheless to honor the Blessed Mother by attending Mass on December 9, or on December 12, the Feast of our Lady of Guadalupe, or on both days.

Please note that in general, Catholics who are unable to attend Mass on a holy day of obligation may seek a dispensation from a priest or deacon of the Diocese, who can either excuse the person from the obligation completely, or substitute another pious work, such as praying the Rosary. Those who are unable to attend Mass due to old age or illness are already dispensed by church law from the obligation to attend, and we are grateful for their prayers at home.


