PREPARES: 10 years of Serving the Unborn, Mothers and Families =

Ashleigh was 18 when she found herself pregnant. Her mother was furious at her daughter's "stupidity" - the word she used to describe the situation. Ashleigh felt something compelling her to keep the baby. It wasn't the father, as they didn't even speak anymore, but there was something in her heart that knew this baby belonged. When she began showing, her mother's criticism only grew, until Ashleigh felt she had to leave.

At 31 weeks pregnant, Ashleigh found herself couch surfing with friends. In her situation, school seemed to be the least of her worries, and she quit going. Understandably, she became overwhelmed and depressed, not knowing where to turn, and knowing that the baby's birth was not far off.

Creating a Plan to Help

Providing support for all pregnant mothers and young families in Washington State has been the goal of PREPARES since its inception in 2014. An initiative of the Bishops of Washington State, led by Bishop Joseph Tyson, the aim was to create a ministry that would support any pregnant woman or new family. "Our ultimate goal," Bishop Tyson explains, "is to make sure that no child, born or unborn, is abandoned or alone. We want to make sure that every mother and father, whether in a rural area or a large urban setting, has a community of caring people around them, walking those first five critical years of life."

Launched in 2014, the PREPARES model was developed specifically to deliver support to struggling new mothers and families. Receiving diapers, clothing, and assistance with connecting to community resources is essential for many PREPARES mothers, especially those who may be many miles from family. Most PRE-PARES families manage on very little income, and struggle to pay for rent, electricity,

groceries, and other daily necessities. PRE-PARES volunteers provide diapers and wipes to families, as well as information on rental assistance, food banks, medical care, and other needed resources.

The PREPARES ministry goes beyond the provision of physical items and community resource information. Each mother participating in PREPARES is offered a family companion to provide a listening ear and non-judgmental support. These caring companions—who are all volunteers—create warm connections and offer a sense of family to mothers and fathers who may feel very alone.

Ashleigh was just four weeks from her due date when the mother of a friend suggested she contact her parish's PREPARES ministry. She gave Ashleigh the phone number of PREPARES and within the week, Ashleigh had met with

after Roe vs. Wade there has actually been an increase. The *New York Times* noted on October 22, 2024 that: "In nearly every state that has banned abortion, the number of women receiving abortions increased between 2020 and the end of 2023, according to the most comprehensive account of all abortions by state since the overturning of Roe v. Wade.

"In the 13 states that enacted near-total abortion bans, the number of women receiving abortions increased in all but three, according to the study. Some women traveled to clinics in states where abortions were legal. Others ordered abortion pills from U.S. doctors online, after doctors in other states started writing prescriptions under shield laws that protect them when they provide mail-order pills to patients in states with bans."

PREPARES provides a positive counterpoint to this trend. Well north of 17,000 families have been touched by PREPARES over these last ten years. I recall one Spanish-speaking woman I met in Moxee. She was on the baptism preparation team. She also formed the core of the new PREPARES group in her parish. A neighbor who knew she was involved with the parish confided in her that her boyfriend had made her an appointment for an abortion. "What do you want to do?" she asked her neighbor. "I would like to try to keep the child." PRE-PARES was able to provide wrap-around support and care for their journey and they are happy parents.

As bishop, I am grateful for the many ways our parishioners work "upstream" before a woman even approaches a clinic. I am grateful for the material support of diapers and bottles and baby formula that fill our PREPARES welcome baskets. I also am grateful to so many of you who support our statewide St. Valentine's Day funding drive each year with your financial gifts.

What accounts for the greatness of PRE-PARES? I think the key ingredient might be in the vision of Pope Francis, who has an amazing way of cutting across the ideologies of the left and the right in focusing on people. In his apostolic exhortation, "Rejoice and Be Glad," he writes:

"Our defense of the innocent unborn, for example, needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life, which is always sacred and demands love for each person, regardless of his or her stage of development. Equally sacred, however, are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly exposed to covert euthanasia, the victims of human trafficking, new forms of slavery, and every form of rejection. We cannot uphold an ideal of holiness that would ignore injustice in a world where some revel, spend with abandon and live only for the latest consumer goods, even as others look on from afar, living their entire lives in abject poverty."

PREPARES brings together a way of living out both our teachings on life and our teaching on justice. It gives a richness to the beauty we see in the creche of Christ as well as the creche of every child we want to protect and every woman we want to accompany. Saint Francis was a genius of the spiritual life in his capacity to make real the event of the incarnation. May we continue to make real the incarnation of Christ by remembering deeply with Pope Benedict XVI that "God comes as a baby!"

Test Your Knowledge About The Catholic 'Saints of Winter'

In all of the preparations for Christmas and Holy Days honoring Blessed Mother, it's easy to overlook the many other wonderful saints whose feast days are celebrated during the Winter season. How many of the following saints can you name? Answers follow at the end.

- 1) January 2. Described as "one of the giants of the early Church" and "one of the great orators of Christianity," this saint, from the area of what is now Israel, died in 379. Both of his parents and several of his nine siblings also are honored as saints. As a monk, he founded several monasteries and became a bishop. He helped establish Nicene teachings in the Church and denounced "Arianism," or the teaching that God the Father was more important than Jesus.
- 2) January 3. The patron saint of Paris, this French woman was consecrated to God at only seven years of age. She later became a nun, teaching, performing charitable acts and making prophesies. Her visions began to turn people against her. She earned the respect of kings, and led people in prayer to be spared from the army of Attila the Hun. After her death in 512, her shrine was carried in procession during a plague. Those who touched the shrine were healed.
- 3) January 5. This American saint was born in 1811 in Bohemia. With too many priests in service and no one to ordain him, he traveled to New York. Ordained a priest by a bishop in New York, he traveled from rural town to town, even celebrating Mass at kitchen tables. He later became a Redemptorist priest and then a bishop. He is known

for establishing the first Catholic school system in a diocese and helping to found many schools before his death at the age of 48,

- 4) January 18. This young saint was the daughter of a European king. She became a novice in the Dominican order of nuns at age 12. She refused any special favors and worked diligently to serve the poorest of the poor and the very sickest hospital patients. No task was too undignified for her. All of her tremendous work and many hours of prayer helped to contribute to exhaustion and led to her death at the age of 29.
- 5) January 20. This saint, who is believed to have been born in France, joined the Roman army, apparently to help other Christians in danger from the Romans. After converting numerous people to the Faith, he was discovered by the Emperor and sentenced to death. Archers shot many arrows at him and he was believed to be dead. However, he survived and confronted the Emperor about his unfair persecution of Christians, only to be sentenced to death again in 288.
- 6) January 28. Best known for his writings, including *Summa Theologiae* (a summary of the most important teachings of the Catholic Church), this saint was born in what is now Italy in 1225. As a young man, he wanted to join the Dominicans, but was captured by his family as he was en route and held captive. In later university studies, he was so quiet that he was dubbed "the dumb ox." However, he went on to become highly educated, and a brilliant writer, with numerous important, philosophical works. He died in 1274.

February 1. This Irish saint is believed to have been born into slavery in 451. In youth, she worked on a dairy farm, showing great charity from a very young age. Wanting to always be chaste, she prayed that her beauty would be taken from her and it was done. Through the years, she founded monasteries, including one for women religious, plus a school of art. She is believed to have been a friend of St. Patrick. She died in 525.

3. A bishop and medical doctor, this saint is the patron of throat illnesses. He is known to have helped patients




