

# Parishioner Of St. Joseph, Wenatchee, To Be Ordained Deacon in Rome

February 23 will be a special day for the Diocese of Yakima as Juan Cruz Gonzalez, a parishioner of St. Joseph Church in Wenatchee, is ordained a permanent deacon by Pope Francis in Rome. The culmination of five years of preparation, Cruz, 51, will join other men from around the world to be ordained as part of the Jubilee of Deacons.

For this pilgrimage, Cruz will be joined by his wife, Veronica, and children, Yareli and Liliana. Altogether, a contingent of 46 pilgrims from the Diocese of Yakima will be joining in the meaningful journey to Rome.

The Holy Father will confer the Sacrament of Holy Orders upon Cruz, making him a "permanent" deacon, a rank of Church hierarchy reserved for single or married men. Other men who wish to become priests receive Holy Orders to become "transitional" deacons, as a final step before becoming priests.

Although he's been in "training" for years, Cruz said he was still taken by surprise when Father Osmar Aguirre, pastor of St. Joseph Church in Wenatchee and director of the diaconate ministry for the Diocese, informed him that not only was he going to become a deacon soon - but that Pope Francis was going to do the honors!

"I get nervous serving with the Bishop. What will it be like with the Holy Father?", Cruz wondered, in a conversation with the Central Washington Catholic. In his characteristically humble manner, he also marveled at how he was chosen for this honor: "I don't consider myself as someone who has a PhD," he observed. "I barely finished high

school."

However, Juan Cruz has performed years of admirable work in St. Joseph Parish, says Father Aguirre.

"Iuan radiates enthusiasm and joy, exemplifying perseverance and commitment in his service," he noted.

In his December 2024 nomination letter for Cruz to Bishop Joseph Tyson, Father Aguirre also observed, "What makes Mr. Cruz unique is his bilingual and bicultural background, which allows him to minister effectively to both English- and Spanish-speaking communities. His dedication to serving others and spending time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament with his wife is a profound witness to his faith. ... His life is a testimony of faith in action, and he exemplifies the qualities of a deacon who will serve the Church with humility, compassion and zeal."

In Rome, the Jubilee of Deacons will open on February 21 with a welcome, midday prayer and sharing of experiences. On Saturday, there will be a pilgrimage to the Holy Door of the Vatican and a vigil at the Basilica of St. John Lateran. Ordination is scheduled during a 10 a.m. Mass in St.

Peter's Squai Sunday.





ng the Mass, Pope Francis 40 lay men and women to stry of lector, a ministry he opened to women in 2021. The women came from Albania, Argentina, Austria, Bolivia, Brazil, Philippines, Iceland, Italy, Mexico, Poland and Slovenia.

The Pope encouraged everyone to take time out each day to read one or two verses of the Gospel,

whether it was during their commute or other brief moments of their day.

"When we read the Scriptures, when we pray and study them, we do not simply receive information about God; we receive his Spirit, who reminds us of all that Jesus said and did," he said in his homily.

In the day's Gospel reading (Lk 4:14-21), Jesus reveals himself as the Messiah, the Pope said. And the reading also reveals "five actions that characterize the unique and universal mission of the Messiah..." Those five

actions are "to bring glad tidings to the poor, ... to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."

"By releasing us from our captivity, he tells us that

God draws close to us in our poverty, redeems us from evil, enlightens our eyes, breaks the yoke of oppression, and brings us into the joy of a time and greater history in which he makes himself constantly present, to walk beside us and to guide us to eternal life," he said.

Marking the beginning of Lent, Ash Wednesday will be observed or March 5 this year. As the Lenten season approaches, here's a reminder of the Church's practices of penance during this time:

- It is recommended to self-impose a fast on all weekdays throughout Lent.
- Catholics are required to fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, March 5, and Good Friday, April 18.
- All Fridays during Lent are mandatory days of abstinence.
- 4. The law of abstinence applies to Catholics aged 14 and older.
- This law prohibits the consumption of meat.
- Fasting is obligatory for Catholics from ages 18 to 59.
- The fasting regulations stipulate that only one full meal should be consumed each day; any additional meals, if necessary, should be considerably smaller while considering one's health needs. Fasting also implies refraining from snacking between meals.
