#### COLLECTION FOR WORLD MISSION SUNDAY 2025

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

World Mission Sunday – the annual Eucharistic celebration for the Missions of the Church – is on October 19 this year. We will take up the annual collection October 18-19. This important day in the life of the Church universally fortifies our understanding of our shared call to mission, bestowed upon us at Baptism.

Established by Pope Pius XI in 1926, it remains the only annual global collection that directly supports the 1,124 mission territories where the Church is young, struggling, or persecuted. On this day, every parish, in every diocese, in every country, joins in prayer and giving to ensure that missionaries can continue their vital work—building churches, forming priests, supporting catechists, and serving communities in need.

Until 1908, the Church in the United States was a mission territory. We relied on this fund to build our churches and seminaries and support our clergy and religious. Today, many foreign missions rely on our generosity to sustain the Church, an instrument of God's love and mercy, His hope and peace.

Tens of thousands of missionary women and men, priests, religious and laity, rely on our prayers every day, not only on World Mission Sunday. These missionaries are building churches, educating children, and healing the wounds caused by war, cruelty, oppression, terror, and despair. With our daily prayer and our generous donation on World Mission Sunday, we all bear witness to the compassion of our Lord Jesus Christ, making Him present in every continent, country, city, family, and heart.

This year, under the theme chosen by the late Pope Francis, "Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples", we are invited to reflect deeply on the meaning of hope in the Christian life. As Saint Paul reminds us, "Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us" (Romans 5:5). Let us join together in prayer and generous support for the missions, so that hope, love, and faith may continue to flourish throughout the world.
