



Dear St. Joseph Community,

Welcome to our Annual Report preview!

Since returning to normalcy, following the interruptions of COVID and administration changes, we have not put forth an Annual Report to our St. Joseph Community. This, among other goals will change for the 2025-26 school year. We wanted to share a little of what we are doing through this preview, presenting the full report at the close of the school year.

This year, SJS is at the height of our 6-year Accreditation cycle. For the past 18 months, we have been working on our Self Study. Looking at our strengths and weaknesses as a school, setting goals for the next 6 years. This February 24-26, an Accreditation Team will visit our school to review and comment on our Self Study. Some of you, will be asked to meet with the team and share your perspective of and your experiences with our school.

Students are participating in three student retreats this year. The first, at the beginning of the year, immersed our students in the practice of Adoration. Led by Fr. Tian Mendoza, the students learned prayers and songs for participating in monthly Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. December's retreat: "Prepare a Place for Him," took place at the beginning of Advent. Following the retreat, students prepared a classroom altar for Jesus. After Epiphany, Jesus - in the Monstrance, will come to visit each classroom altar.

Another goal this year has been to integrate our school with our parish community. You may have noticed our students lecturing, singing and altar serving at the 11:00 Mass. You may have purchased raffle tickets for the statue of Mary - a joint Parish Youth Group and School fundraiser.

We appreciate the generous support of time, talent and treasure our St. Joseph Community shares with our school, you are a contributing part of our success. We look forward to a continued growth in Mind, Body and Spirit of our students and families.


